Resolution No. 2023-3099

A Resolution of the City of Sanford, Florida, amending the City's annual operating budget for the fiscal year beginning October 1, 2022 and ending September 30, 2023 to address procurement of a Marina damage providing for implementing assessment report: providing for a administrative actions: savings providing for conflicts; providing for provision: severability and providing for an effective date.

Whereas, the Commission of the City of Sanford, Florida has adopted an annual operating budget for the fiscal year beginning October 1, 2022 and terminating on September 30, 2023 specifying certain projected revenues and expenditures for the operations of Sanford municipal government; and

Whereas the City's budget presumes that each department generally will, to the best of their ability, maintain its expenditures within its allocated budgeted level and exercise prudence in expending funds during the course of the City's fiscal year; and

Whereas, from time-to-time circumstances and events may require that the original City budget may need revision such as to address the procurement of a Marina damage assessment report; and

Whereas, the City Commission, in its judgment and discretion, has the authority to adjust the budget to more closely coincide with actual and expected events.

Now, therefore, be it adopted and resolved by the City Commission of the City of Sanford; Florida as follows:

Section 1. Adoption of Budget Amendment; Procurement of Services From Neel-Schaffer, Inc. in Association with Edgewater Resources, LLC for a Marina Damage Assessment Report.

The annual operating budget of the City of Sanford for the fiscal year beginning

October 1, 2022 and terminating on September 30, 2023 is hereby revised and amended by Attachment "A" pertaining to funds for the procurement of services from Neel-Schaffer Inc. in Association with Edgewater Resources, LLC for a Marina damage assessment report. The Attachment is hereby incorporated into this Resolution as if fully set forth herein verbatim. Except as amended herein, the annual operating budget for the City of Sanford for fiscal year beginning October 1, 2022 and terminating on September 30, 2023 shall remain in full force and effect.

Section 2. Implementing administrative actions.

The City Manager, or designee, is hereby authorized and directed to implement the provisions of this Resolution by means of such administrative actions as may be deemed necessary and appropriate to procure a Marina damage assessment report.

Section 3. Savings.

The prior actions of the City of Sanford relating to the adoption of the City budget and related activities are hereby ratified and affirmed.

Section 4. Conflicts.

All resolutions or parts of resolutions in conflict with this Resolution are hereby repealed.

Section 5. Severability.

If any section, sentence, phrase, word, or portion of this Resolution is determined to be invalid, unlawful or unconstitutional, said determination shall not be held to invalidate or impair the validity, force or effect of any other section, sentence, phrase, word, or portion of this Resolution not otherwise determined to be invalid, unlawful, or unconstitutional.

Section 6. Effective Date.

This Resolution shall become effective immediately upon enactment.

TASK AUTHORIZATION

TASK 1

Description of Work: Initial Meeting and Site Visit. Neel-Schaffer engineers along with our subconsultant, Edgewater Resources, will meet with the City and their FEMA consultant to discuss the approach to documenting and assessing damages from Hurricane Ian. We will perform an initial site visit to walk the property and perform a high-level assessment of the damages associated with Hurricane Ian. This task will include preparation of an updated drone aerial mapping image of the entire Marina property and collection of photos to document damages identified by visual inspection to areas accessible by walking the site. These deliverables will be incorporated into a Damage Assessment report (Task 3).

Contract Price: \$3,840.00

Contract Time: 5 calendar days

TASK 2

Description of Work: Bathymetric Survey. This task includes an updated Bathymetric Survey which is recommended to fully identify the change in underwater topography that has occurred between the previous surveys and the new surveys and to define areas that may require dredging or repair to allow safe boating maneuvers. This survey will identify areas that have silted in/deposited fill/changed and/or shifted significantly from Hurricane Ian surge and water movements and affected the bottom contours of the marina basin and surrounding areas.

Price: \$5,845.00

Time: 30 calendar days

TASK 3

Description of Work: Damage Assessment Report and Cost Estimates. The team will prepare a report that will outline the extent of the directly related Hurricane Ian damages to the marine/marina elements. The report will include a cost estimate separated into mitigated improvements and improvements to make the marina equal to its pre-hurricane condition. The cost estimate will identify:

- · Damage from the storm including replacement and repair estimates
- · New replacement costs of in-kind elements
- · New replacement costs of elements conforming to the new master plan



If applicable, we may provide recommendations to adjust the master plan to optimize FEMA funding in terms of funds received or anticipated, and how quickly those funds can be received. A Draft report will be submitted for review followed by a final report once comments are made.

Description of Work: Follow-up Site Visit/Meetings. SYNOPSIS:

Approval of Resolution No. 2023-3099 to amend the budget and a procurement of damage assessment services relating to the Sanford Marina from Neel-Schaffer, Inc. of Sanford and Edgewater Resources, LLC, of St. Joseph, Michigan (through its Pompano Beach office) is requested.

FISCAL/STAFFING STATEMENT:

The total lump sum fee for Marina damage assessment services is \$28,185. Funding is available from the General Fund reserves. The damage assessment efforts could commence immediately from acceptance of the proposal after the proposed action. The work would be performed under the City's continuing services agreement under RFQ 14/15-16.

BACKGROUND:

The City Commission has taken steps to commit fund balances to several City needs including marina repairs, improvements and master planning services. In late September, 2022, Hurricane Ian significantly damaged docks, flooded the Marina office and dry storage building. Since Hurricane Ian's impacts on the Marina, the priorities for repair and replacement of slips and docks need to be re-evaluated.

City staff has engaged the City's Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) consultant to discuss the approach to document and assess the damages from Hurricane Ian. The proposal from Neel-Schaffer is the recommendation from City staff, the FEMA consultant, and Neel-Schaffer to proceed with improving the Marina. The City plans to submit for FEMA reimbursement for the repairs and/or replacement of the docks caused by Ian. The City is continuing to work on improvements needed to bring the marina to safe, proper working conditions. As part of this initiative, it is requested to engage Neel–Schaffer to perform a damage assessment from Hurricane Ian under the City's continuing services agreement due to their marina expertise and experience in association with Edgewater Resources.

A proposal has been received from Neel-Schaffer to provide damage assessment services for the Sanford Marina. Based on similar projects of this nature and recommendations from the City's FEMA consultant, Neel-Schaffer has proposed the following damage assessment services consists of 4 tasks detailed as follows:

- (1) Site Visit/Initial Meeting this task would entail meeting with the City and its FEMA consultant to discuss documenting and assessing damages from Hurricane Ian. This task will include preparation of updated drone aerial mapping images of the entire Marina and collection of photos to document damages identified by visual inspection by walking the site.
- (2) Bathymetric Survey this task would include an updated survey to identify the change in underwater topography since the previous surveys and the conditions from Hurricane Ian's impacts.
- (3) Damage Assessment Report & Cost Estimates this task would include preparation of a report outlining the direct cost estimate related to Hurricane Ian.
- (4) Follow-up Site Visit/ Meetings this task would assist the City through meetings and discussions with FEMA representatives to support the findings.

LEGAL REVIEW:

The Assistant City Attorney has reviewed the materials and prepared Resolution No. 2023-3099and has no legal objection. The procurement activity will occur in accordance with the requirements of the City's Purchasing Policies and Procedures.

RECOMMENDATION:

City staff recommends that the City Commission approve Resolution No. 2023-3099, amending the budget in the amount of \$28,185 and approve the procurement of services form Neel-Schaffer in association with Edgewater Resources for Sanford Marina damages from Hurricane Ian.
